From the Editor

Fall is definitely fully upon us. As usual, the season is marked by the presence of some fantastic boats arriving at the yards. In Thomaston the frequent shoulder season visitor 95' "La Joie de Mer" captained by Sebastian is in for some work before heading south. Additionally, the 54' steel expedition yacht "Pelagic" has returned after an expedition to Greenland. LM's fabrication shop will be doing some hot work while the captain, Thor, joins the Pelagic fleet's other boat in Antarctica (also big shout out to Thor for being one of the best surfers to surf the Maine coast). I guess after surfing in Greenland water temps in Maine seem pretty nice. Thomaston Service is also doing an amazing job of getting Hound's new keel onto the boat and getting her south to Antigua before winter sets in. She will spend the winter cruising and racing in the Caribbean, including doing the RORC Caribbean 600 race!

Camden is also getting the shoulder season clients out the door while gearing up for some big winter refits. Frequent visitor "Namaste" and her captain Willow are on the dock, and the beautiful wooden sloop "Blue Peter" is in getting some work done before they both head to the Caribbean. As the team works on those tight timeline projects, "Zemphira" and "Carmella" are both getting decommissioned and into the sheds for extensive winter refits. All this will be done alongside some smaller but no less complicated refits like "Grace", "Charley" and "Hawksbill".

The boatbuilding team continues to do the impossible by building the two Navier boats, the Hunt 42 and the Hood 35 while simultaneously planning for the S&S 65, which will be one of the most technically complex boats LM has ever built.

Technologies is concluding an exciting quarter with the successful install of the Kendall Square Canopy over the MIT subway stop in Boston. The LM install team managed to get the job done in less than the anticipated time, even though they had to delicately lift and steer the canopy between two buildings not once, but twice! Rumor is that good times were had by all inside the canopy... Meanwhile, the Fab Shop is continuing to work on the two aluminum boats they have in build and are about to start two more. They are also working on some components for the Portsmouth Navy Shipyard and gearing up for some Lean manufacturing training.

There have also been some personnel changes at LM this past quarter. Tyler Eads, Assistant Service Yard Manager in Camden, recently decided to move on. We thank him for his hard work and wish him the best of luck! Meanwhile, Jon Kirby recently started as Assistant Service Yard Manager in Thomaston, and two new service managers have been hired to work in Camden for the 2022-2023 season. This is all excellent news and means we have more management support in both service yards. Additionally, our Safety Officer, Charlie Adams, is moving on to take a job as a full time firefighter in Rockland. We have identified a short list of candidates and plan to make a job offer for that position shortly. Meanwhile, the whole team continues to grow and I believe by the time this goes to presses we will officially be at 150 employees and still growing. With this many boat builds and refits, growing and retaining the team continues to be a top priority and with expanded employee housing options, a competitive pay scale and an always increasing focus on meeting everyone's career needs, LM is working as hard as possible to be the best place to work in Maine.


Projects - Boatbuilding

The Hood 35LM Hull #2 is underway in Thomaston. This boat is set to be the flybridge version and will be powered by stern drives. Based off of the comments we received at the Newport Boat Show with hull #1, we're sure this boat will be a hit as well. Expected launch of Hull #2 will be spring 2023.





The *Lyman-Morse Monhegan 42* will be pulled out of it's mold very soon. This will be our third Monhegan 42 and will feature the sedan version. This boat will also be launched in the spring.





Navier 27 is nearing completion and will be undergoing sea trials in the next couple of weeks. Following successful sea trials, one of the two boats will be shipped down to Florida for the Fort Lauderdale International Boat Show in October.

Lyman-Morse will begin building a 65' Custom S&S Sailboat in the next couple on months. 
Carmella, a 92' Vitters built in 1999 is coming back to Camden with a new owner this year. She is set to receive a new teak deck and have some coatings work done.


 Transporting the canopy down to Boston was no easy task. First, the team needed to pull the two structures out of the building and hoist

them onto the barge.






The barge then headed south to Boston and made a passage up the Charles River where the canopy was hoisted through the busy streets of Boston to it's final destination iaboveKendall Square


